




"Nordiska villa"/"Harppulinna", dacha of architect Gavriil Baranovsky. 1930th.

Architect Nikolai Krykov (1872-1910) graduated from the Institute of Civil Engineers in SPb in 1895. In the same year he married Lidija Kobeleva, the sister of Ekaterina, the wife of architect Gavriil Baranovsky. In 1906 he bought the plot "Novaja" in Kellomaki nearby the plot of Baranovsky, but in 1910 he died prematurely and dacha was sold. Nevertheless, Lidija with her children continued to live in Kellomaki and stayed there after 1917. In 1920th-1930th the Krykov family has become related with Sandin, Zabelin and Sidorov families.
